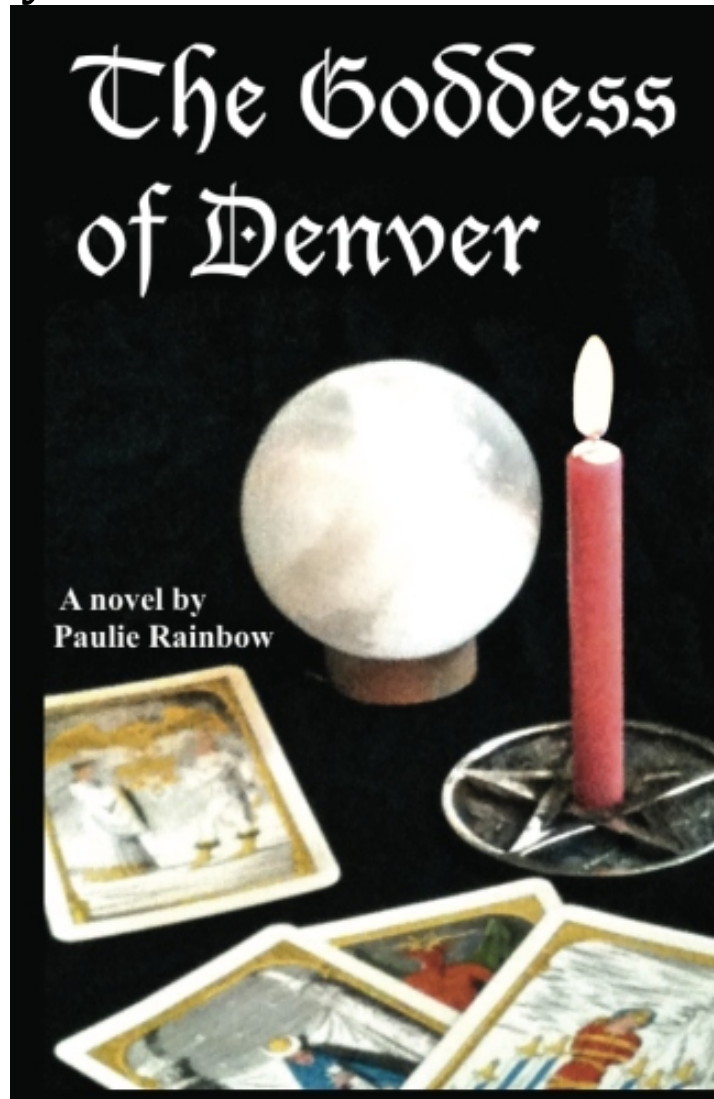


One year since its Denver Release:
